





Reflecting on Our 2020 COVID Journey

The year 2020 took us to a whole new level of reflection, when you consider that the world we live in was turned upside down by COVID-19. And while there was, and continues to be, profound tragedy surrounding the effects of this dreaded virus, this year's reflection also bears light on the formidable strength of our agency, its people and the critical role we play in the community. Our staff experienced several logistical and emotional transitions as the initial wave of COVID cases in our community increased. Pressure to learn and adapt to administering care, while wearing personal protective

equipment, was met with some hesitation by staff, whose care is based on connecting personally with those they serve. The smiles on the faces of our staff were now hidden behind semi-breathable cotton shields. It was also critical to respond to all the demands rapidly and to work closely with our community partners to assist patients and caregivers as they navigated the complexities created by the pandemic.

Facilitating the union of family with the dying during crisis seemed familiar, and it inevitably inspired staff and community to respond with a new sense of purpose.

As our country and county learned more about the virus, the requirements for protection of both clinical and support staff resulted in serving patients through virtual means. Crash courses in Zoom, WebEx and FaceTime were offered and received with trepidation. Operating through a "screen presence," every possible effort was made to treat, support and comfort.

Clinical and support staff navigated a difficult course, while the administration continued to follow the hour-by-hour clinical, financial and regulatory updates—all of which needed to be communicated to staff in real time. Fear and frustration were also the experience by the patients and families who were, at times, denied access to each other. When the stories of loved ones who were not allowed to be at the bedside of the dying began to surface, it did not take long for our teams to pull together and find safe, creative and expedient ways to bring

the dying either home or to our Inpatient Unit, where they could reunite with their loved ones. Facilitating the union of families has been a priority that has inspired our staff and our community. This was particularly true for our staff, who themselves experienced isolation from family members, and some who themselves had lost loved ones during the COVID-19 pandemic. Through their own grief (complicated grief is actually a diagnosis), we watched as they worked tirelessly, finding comfort in helping others in our community cope with the devastating effects of this virus. Amidst the fear and uncertainty, what arose were stories of perseverance and dedicated service to our community as well as to each other.

To our staff, patients, families and community partners, may we continue to work together with resolve and gratitude, while sharing in our hope for a brighter 2021. ■



A tumultuous four months ago, November was celebrated as National Hospice and Palliative Care Month.

This is an opportunity to raise awareness about the unique programs in our community, which enable patients and families to live as comfortably and fully as possible despite life-limiting or serious illness. It is a chance to acknowledge the skilled, selfless, compassionate service of the doctors, nurses, social workers, clergy, counselors, volunteers and staff who comprise the interdisciplinary teams delivering that care.

One of the first dozen hospices in America, Hospice & Palliative Care Buffalo is now one of more than 4,500 programs nationally providing symptom control, pain management, psychosocial, spiritual and bereavement care to patients and families. Last year, nearly 1.5 million people across the country availed themselves of these services.

While that number grows each year, care is often sought late in the course of advanced illness, mitigating the potential benefits of goal achievement, comfort and even prolonged survival. Sad to say, that is the experience locally as well — despite national and international recognition for local programs' scope of service, innovation and research, the length of stay for hospice patients in Western New York remains stubbornly, disappointingly low.

Hospice is more than a place, and while we are fortunate to have hospice campuses and inpatient units, most care is received in patients' homes. Wherever rendered, hospice embodies a philosophy of comprehensive, competent, holistic care. It recognizes the patient to be more than the one in the bed, with physical, psychic and spiritual needs that go beyond the capabilities of any

single practitioner. An entire psychosocial patientfamily constellation needs be cared for as well, through illness into bereavement, and hospice programs are uniquely designed and coordinated to do just that.

It's been said that one death is a tragedy; a thousand deaths is a statistic. In these times of anxiety, uncertainty and epidemic, when large numbers of the infected, ill and dying claim attention by virtue of magnitude, when hyperbole commands publicity, it is reassuring that hospice has never wavered from its founding principles and promise to the patient: "You matter because you are you. You matter to the last moment of your life. We will do all we can, not only to help you die peacefully, but also to help you live until you die."

This is what deserves celebration — the eloquent affirmation of hospice's commitment to being the exemplary ally of us all in the struggle to stay humane, to care about and for each other throughout our shared journey. In so doing, we may be privileged not only to facilitate the emergence of the best in human nature, but also to witness the grace of which we are capable when, as fellow travelers, we care and are cared for.

Massage Therapy

Illness can peel away the layers of the individual. Those with terminal and/or chronic illness may experience not only physical and mental decline, but loss of independence and identity, as well as loss of the routine opportunities we take for granted to connect with one another — to touch and be touched. The symptoms of illness can further compound these losses as the experiences of pain, anxiety, lethargy and confusion may not only limit an individual's ability to seek and facilitate touch, but also to receive and be touched. Massage therapy offers patients intentional, purposeful and meaningful touch. It can alleviate pain and anxiety, induce relaxation, support function and enhance well-being, as well as provide the comfort of connection.

Massage therapist Joan Thompson offers a reflection of her engagement with patients in both our home and facility care environments. Joan has been with Hospice & Palliative Care Buffalo's Expressive Therapies team since 2016, upon her family's return to WNY from Westchester County. Joan trained at the Center for Natural Wellness School of Massage Therapy in Albany, NY. In addition to her 15 years as a massage therapist, she has 13 years of experience working in the field of mental health.

I believe that humans are essentially social beings, and most of us crave caring, respectful touch. Touch can be healing on many levels. From a chummy pat on the back from a teammate to a mother's hug after a skinned knee, touch can communicate so many things: camaraderie, affection, love and comfort. The recent months have challenged us as touch has been discouraged for obvious reasons, but it has solidified my belief in how important it is.

As a massage therapist for Hospice & Palliative Care Buffalo, I consider it a great honor to be present with my patients to provide comfort and relief through the power of touch. Often, it is not always solely the therapeutic rubbing of sore muscles — there is a connection that can be made through a gentle soothing massage that is unique. A sacred space is created when massage therapy is offered and received. Sometimes this "energy" is palpable. Patients' family members often state they feel relaxed just by the experience of watching their loved one receive a massage. In these cases, this is an added benefit to caregivers and family members who work so hard to take care of their loved ones.

As a member of the care team, our massage therapists thoroughly assess the patient's condition and symptoms to formulate a care-plan that meets their needs related to pain, anxiety, range of motion, breathing and relaxation. There are a variety of techniques utilized, including kneading, stretching, sweeping strokes, gentle strokes and holds, and acupressure points, to name just a few.

At times, patients may benefit from a massage on their back or neck to relieve pain and tension; at other times they may benefit from a gentle hand or scalp massage and a caring presence to assist with relieving anxiety. Although massage therapy may not be for everyone, many wonder why they waited so long to finally give it a try. Some patients have described their experience as a feeling of "melting" or "floating" as they relax and their muscles "let go."


There certainly is a degree of trust that needs to exist between the massage therapist and the patient/caregivers. This trust is established through the therapist's supportive and open communication regarding both the benefits and limitations of massage. Establishing rapport and facilitating an emotionally safe environment is essential so that the patient and their caregivers feel comfortable and are empowered to ask questions and voice concerns, as well as express needs, responses and outcomes. Sometimes, the benefits of massage extend beyond the typical hands-on technique. We often find our presence

means the lending of a supportive ear to listen or an extra smile to brighten a day. We may be witness to tears or laughter or both while providing respect and regard in our caring touch. Patients often speak about life events, family and friends and/or how their illness has affected their lives.

This work has changed me in a profoundly positive way. Although there are days that challenge me, I am continuously reminded how important it is to have appreciation and show gratitude for the loved ones in my life. I am constantly in awe of the caregivers whose first priority is the comfort and care of their loved one, and I am humbled by those I have worked with in the final days and even minutes of their lives. My experiences have given me a greater appreciation for the true connections that can exist between individuals, if only for a brief time.

People often ask, "What do you like about your job?" A common response is, "Every day is different; no two days are the same." In my case, this is absolutely true. I wake up each day knowing that every patient and every family needs something different. The word "comfort" is described differently depending who you are talking to. Often, I am keenly aware that I must act quickly to address a patient's

medical and emotional needs while offering reassurance and support to their loved ones. Though this role can be challenging, the personal reward is great because I know I am helping those that are seeking comfort and dignity. Just recently, I received a beautiful card from the daughter of a patient, expressing her gratitude. Another reminder of why I do what I do!

I Wish I Called Sooner

As a hospice admission nurse, I often have patients tell me that they think it may be too soon to be enrolled in hospice. Commonly I will hear, "I don't think I am going to die tomorrow or in the next few days, so I don't know why you are here now." This was a conversation I had this past spring with a woman in her 70s, struggling with pulmonary fibrosis. She and her husband were seeking assistance, and they both expressed that home care was what they wanted.

During my visit, the patient shared her wish to avoid going to the hospital, a common sentiment, and even more so now due to the COVID-19 pandemic. She also explained she was weak, anxious, unable to sleep and struggled with shortness of breath. Once I shared information about hospice services and support in detail, they both agreed that hospice care would provide them the assistance they were seeking.

Shortly after hospice enrollment, their case nurse reported that the patient was feeling better. In fact,



the patient remarked that she felt better than she had in a long time. Her medications were adjusted, her symptoms were minimized, and she now had an adjustable hospital bed at home, allowing for greater comfort. The couple was thankful they had not waited longer to seek support. Hospice & Palliative Care Buffalo provided home care resources for this couple for almost four months versus just the days or weeks they understood it to be.


Too often I hear, "I wish I would have called sooner." I feel fortunate that I am someone who can provide reassurance that it is the right care, at the right time, just when you need it!

In addition to the financial stress and struggles, he worried about his grandchildren, who were young and likely didn't understand grandpa's

illness. Felicia, an HPCB social worker, was looking for a creative way to put smiles on the faces of his grandchildren while also giving him some peace and comfort. The Angel Fund came to the rescue and provided her with a car full of goodies to share with the grandchildren, who ranged from 1 to 22 years old. Felicia also wanted to make sure the patient was able to see his grandchildren's joy one last time, so she had photos taken of them receiving the treats, smiling with excitement. The pictures were printed and taped to grandpa's bed rails so he could see them when he woke up and be at peace.

Hospice & Palliative Care Buffalo's

Graduate Nurse Residency Program

Any nurse leader or human resource recruiter in the country can attest to the sleepless nights accrued over the past several years when considering the nursing shortage.

One could spend numerous hours combing through scholarly articles, citing the past, present and future analytics of the profession's entry and exit scorecard. The recurrent themes paint a bleak picture, despite an increase in nursing school enrollment. According to the American Association of Colleges of Nursing, there are three elements that create the perfect storm. First, the number of nurses at or near retirement is at an all-time high. The average age of a nurse today is 50. Couple that with an anticipated minimal increase in nursing school enrollment from 2019–2029, and one can determine that we will not have enough nurses to replace the mass exodus soon to be realized. The most sobering statistic, however, is that 13% of nurses change careers in the first year, and 37% say they are ready to consider a change. It is the potential 50% loss, before they even gain traction in the profession, that triggered a more strategic approach on how and who we sought to hire.

Most hospices, because of the unique and specialized provision of care rendered, require a one- to two-year level of experience in a facilitybased setting, be it a hospital or nursing home. It is believed that this will assure the clinician has a foundation to build upon once they step foot in the hospice human resource department. We decided to take a different approach. Research has shown that many nurses who abandon the profession prematurely do so because they become disenchanted with the image and purpose they were drawn to when they entered nursing school. The desire to heal, make whole, comfort and support, while interfacing with like-minded practitioners, is often replaced with the burden

of short-staffing patterns that catapult novice nurses into clinical situations for which they are not prepared — not because they lack education, but because they lack the experiential notches in their clinical belt. As a result, they are unable to spend the time with patients and families they were accustomed to while in school. More importantly, they realize that the difference they were hoping to make might not happen. So, we set out to hire nurses who are fresh out of school, to give them what they need most: time to develop; time with supportive, specially trained mentors; and one-onone time with patients and families.

The Graduate Nurse Residency Program (GNRP) promotes the continuation of excellence in endof-life and palliative care for patients through an extended orientation and mentorship that serve to support, guide and protect the newly licensed, newly hired hospice and palliative nurse. The program's design includes both classroom and field training for six months after our agency clinical orientation is complete. The participants are not hired for a particular position. Rather, they are exposed to all areas of hospice and palliative care not only to identify where they feel most comfortable, but also to understand how each department interfaces. This awareness results in a more cohesive nursing team and, ultimately, better care. Once the program is completed, the resident is placed in an area where they feel most comfortable. If there is no position available at that time, they agree to take a position where the need is greatest.

Our first class of four graduated from the program this past December. Each was placed in the area of their choice, where they received another four weeks of location-specific orientation. The most exciting and unanticipated outcome of the program was the waiting list of new graduates that applied for the January 2021 class. The

word of mouth from our first class highlighted the program's ability to achieve satisfaction, confidence and, most importantly, a continuation of the purpose to which they were initially drawn. As a result, we now have six residents in the January '21 class. One pioneer resident's evaluation supported our original hypothesis: "Nurses come to the profession with aspirations of healing the whole of a person when they are most vulnerable. I was given the chance to be the nurse I dreamed I could be, and I will never be able

to fully express the gratitude I feel." Hospice & Palliative Care Buffalo is committed to helping new nurses reach and retain those aspirations.

Hospice (the 7-letter word I never wanted to hear)

JOE MILLER, BROTHER AND PRIMARY CAREGIVER

Whenever I heard the word "hospice," I thought that someone was going to die within the next few hours or days. I am here to tell you that I couldn't have been more wrong!

In June of 2020, my older brother Hal received word that his cancer had spread to his liver and lungs. His physician shared that his prognosis was likely three to six months. After many meetings at Roswell, my brother made the decision that he didn't want to go through chemotherapy or radiation for the second time.

After much discussion, I contacted Hospice
Palliative Care Buffalo (HPCB) to ask for help. Lynn,
an outreach representative, came to my house
to meet with me, my brother and my wife and to
answer questions about hospice care and services.
With utmost respect, compassion and kindness,
our questions and concerns were addressed.
We now understood the care that HPCB would
offer my brother and our family, and thankfully,
my brother's insurance would cover all costs
associated with hospice, which I now understand
is most often the case.

Upon our request, a nurse and social worker came to my brother's apartment to make sure his living conditions were suitable for his upcoming journey and to admit him into HPCB's care. I was present at this visit, and once again, the hospice representatives spent a lot of time getting to know my brother. Hal explained that he wanted to stay in his apartment, especially given the current visitation restrictions in facilities due to COVID-19.

Currently, a nurse, social worker, chaplain and doctor are handling my brother's care, and they will be with him throughout his journey. HPCB also provided suggestions about other things to consider, such as pre-planning my brother's funeral mass, taking care of his burial needs, legal planning, life insurance review and countless other details that we, as a family, may have delayed.

Hospice is a gift. I have peace of mind knowing that my brother will live his life with dignity and comfort surrounded by his family and friends.



As we reflect on this past year, it was anything but ordinary.

We had to rethink and reimagine much of what we do. We are grateful to have a robust volunteer team, often exceeding 900 active volunteers in normal times. Our response to COVID-19 impacted our volunteers, pausing our volunteer services and activities.

Volunteers are the backbone of our organization. When people think of volunteer work at Hospice & Palliative Care Buffalo, they may often think that volunteers only work directly with patients or families. While we do have volunteers that work directly with patients, we also have volunteers who help with so much more, such as supporting our various departments on campus with administrative tasks and supporting our organization overall by giving their time at our events. Volunteers help us to achieve so much.

Volunteer services were paused last year. We welcomed a small group of volunteers back to our campus over the summer and fall months to help with campus gardens, as they were able to work safely outdoors. As the weather turned

colder and the days grew shorter, we started to look at new opportunities for volunteers. Working with our clinical staff, we identified areas of need. In response, Patient Support Volunteers have assisted with contactless activities to help support our clinical staff. Additionally, they started making friendly phone calls or writing cards and notes to patients or their caregivers. Phone calls turned into weekly chats and check-ins, and letters turned into pen pals. Individuals who had been socially isolated because of the pandemic now had the opportunity to connect with someone from their community: a volunteer.

Normally, it's not uncommon for us to have hundreds of volunteers helping over the holiday months. They decorate the campus, sell buffalos and angel ornaments, deliver meals and gifts, and much more. In working with our volunteers, the magic of the season is brought to life. The holidays looked very different this past year than previous years, but we were committed to remaining true to our mission. We were able to bring some joy during the season to our patients and families in our hospice and Essential Care programs. We had about 20 Patient Support Volunteers assist with delivering meals to patient families at Thanksgiving, as well as meal and gift deliveries at Christmas. Our patients and families were the priority, and volunteers were there to help.

Regardless of their role, volunteers are a special group of individuals who help connect our community. While volunteer services have been limited over this past year, and the work of a volunteer has changed, our volunteers remain committed and are always ready to lend a helping hand when needed. We look forward to days ahead when volunteers fully resume their work, doing what they do best.

Forever Grateful & Giving Back

Volunteers come to Hospice & Palliative Care Buffalo for various reasons. Some are passionate about the cause, and some are looking to spend free time in meaningful ways. For Robert (Bob) Schreck, an attorney at the Barnes Firm and Hospice & Palliative Care Buffalo board member, his volunteerism truly comes from the heart as a way to give back for the utmost care he and his family feel was generously extended to them. Bob became a board member because he wanted to "do more than just being a donor," as Bob puts it.

Bob's story started 10 years ago when his dad had surgery and unexpectedly did not regain consciousness. His family decided to place him in hospice care during these last few days of Dad's life, as that was one of the care options the hospital was offering. Bob and his family were devastated by the news that their father would not recover, and the end of life was near.

Thinking back to those last three days of his dad's life, Bob recalled, "It was amazing to witness so many wonderful people who were providing care and comfort to an unconscious man, but they were acting like he was conscious." Bob said this was an incredible comfort to him and his family.

Shortly after this, the Schreck family went through more heartache when Bob's 88-year-old mother fell and broke her hip, causing much pain and further deterioration of health. The family, once again, had to decide on a care plan at this difficult time. They chose hospice care, since they were already familiar with it and had had such a great experience.

Bob and his family were in awe again as they witnessed the hospice team of nurses, aides, expressive

therapists, spiritual care counselors and bereavement

professionals working their magic to care for not only their mom/grandmother, but to help each of them to feel comfort as well.

The Schreck family was at ease knowing that mom/ grandma had no pain or discomfort. Bob described his mom, who was very beautiful and tall and prided herself on being well-manicured, well-dressed and always wearing a fresh coat of lipstick. "She never left the house without her lipstick," Bob commented fondly. As his mom grew thinner and weaker over the next week, Bob told his boys that grandma would be very upset if she went to heaven with no lipstick. "Suddenly, a nurse came back into her room and applied lipstick on mom," recalled Bob with a smile and a tear. "Mom died an hour later on Christmas Eve. That was such a kind, thoughtful, generous and amazing thing to do for mom! Getting the lipstick was probably just a part of a normal day for that nurse because it's just what they do. My only regret is that I don't know who the nurse was to thank her today."


